## About the charities

### FRIENDS OF CHAFYN GROVE SCHOOL (FCGS)

FCGS helps to support and enhance the Chafyn Grove experience for children and families. As well as helping host events, the funds raised are invested directly back into the school. In the past three years funds raised by FCGS have gone towards new library books, textbooks, sports equipment and art resources as well as bigger items such as the:

- Climbing wall
- Wendy house
- Netball posts and protectors

When allocating funds, the committee focus on what will benefit all children from across the school and the same principles will apply to funds raised from the Summer Ball.

### SALISBURY FOODBANK

Salisbury Foodbank provides a warm welcome, support and three-day emergency food parcels to people in hardship in the local community. Local professionals such as GPs and teachers identify people in need and provide a voucher exchanged at the food bank.

Last year the food bank handed out 42,777 meals with the cost-of-living crisis leading to a rise in need. Just last month, the food bank helped 800 people across Salisbury, distributing 7,200 meals. This is double the amount of supported needed in September 2021.

Salisbury Foodbank is part of the Trussell Trust network which, alongside supporting food banks, pushes for positive solutions that will help people tackle extreme poverty. Last year food banks across the network handed out 2.1 million food parcels, 832,000 of which went to children.

As well as the support from the ball, students and families will be given the opportunity to visit the warehouse and help sort and pack food, toiletry and care packages.
